Please note that any new information since our previous correspondence has been CAPITALISED for your easy reference.

Continue to wear a surgical mask at all times within the home.

Exclude All Staff and Visitors from entering a residential aged care home who:

- Live in a household with a person who is currently self-isolating.
- Have been to any of the latest COVID9 Locations in NSW (INCLUDING THE CASUAL CONTACTS LIST) at the times and dates listed DURING THE PAST 14 DAYS, except for the monitor for symptoms list.
- Have a fever (37.5°C or higher) or any symptoms consistent with COVID-19 infection, even if mild. Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, headache, fatigue, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, and loss of taste or loss of smell. Other reported symptoms of COVID-19 include muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite and acute blocked nose congestion.
- Are a close contact of a person with confirmed COVID-19 and within their selfisolation period.
- ARE WAITING FOR A COVID-19 TEST RESULT.
- Have been to or are from the
 - NORTHERN AREA OF THE NORTHERN BEACHES
 - SUBURBS IN THE CATERBURY LGA (ASHBURY, BELFIELD, CAMPSIE, CATERBURY, CLEMTON PARK, CROYDON PARK, EARLWOOD, HURLSTONE PARK)
 - Cumberland City Council
 - SUBURBS IN THE MT DRUITT AREA (BIDWELL, BLACKETT, DOONSIDE, DHARRUK, EMERTON, HEBERSHAN, LETHBRIDGE PARK, MINCHINBURY, MOUNT DRUITT, SHALVEY, TREGEAR, WHALAN, WILMOT)
 - Rooty Hill.

Visitor Numbers:

- Hunter and Mid Coast Residential Aged Care Homes no restrictions on number of visitors between 9am-12noon and 1pm-5pm except all homes can only accommodate a maximum of 3 people in a resident room at any one time
- Warnervale Gardens, Central Coast can have a maximum of two visitors each day per resident. They may be different visitors each day. Visitor hours between 9am-12noon and 1pm-5pm.

HUNTER AND MID COAST RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE HOMES RESIDENTS
 CAN VISIT FAMILY IN THEIR HOMES WHERE THERE ARE NO MORE THAN 50 VISITORS AT ANY ONE TIME

- CAN LEAVE THE FACILITY FOR OUTINGS SUCH AS MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS OR TO VISIT LOCATIONS IN THE COMMUNITY SUCH AS SHOPS AND CAFES.
- WARNERVALE GARDENS, CENTRAL COAST RESIDENTS
 CAN ATTEND OUTINGS SUCH AS MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS, VISIT LOCATIONS IN THE COMMUNITY SUCH AS SHOPS AND CAFES
 - CAN ATTEND FAMILY GATHERINGS WHERE THERE ARE FEWER THAN 5 PEOPLE.

PLEASE NOTE RESIDENT OR PERSON RESPONSIBLE ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE A RISK ASSESSMENT FORM PRIOR TO LEAVING THE RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE HOME.

FOR ALL OUTINGS AND EXCURSIONS ATTENDED BY RESIDENTS PLEASE ENSURE THAT THERE IS NO-ONE AT THE EVENT MEETING THE CRITERIA AS LISTED IN THE VISITOR EXCLUSIONS ABOVE DURING THE LAST 14 DAYS.
