

Anglican Care Advice to Residents, Families & Friends COVID-19 Update - VISITATION

Please note that any new information since our previous correspondence has been CAPITALISED for your easy reference.

Continue to wear a surgical mask at all times within the home.

Exclude All Staff and Visitors from entering a residential aged care home who:

- Live in a household with a person who is currently self-isolating.
- Have been to any of the latest COVID-19 Locations in NSW (including the casual contacts list) at the times and dates listed during the past 14 days, except for the monitor for symptoms list.
- Have a fever (37.5°C or higher) or any symptoms consistent with COVID-19 infection, even if mild. Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, headache, fatigue, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, and loss of taste or loss of smell. Other reported symptoms of COVID-19 include muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite and acute blocked nose congestion.
- Are a close contact of a person with confirmed COVID-19 and within their self-isolation period.
- Are waiting for a COVID-19 test result.
- Have been to or are from the
 - ANY PERSON WHO HAS BEEN TO ANY VICTORIAN VENUES OF CONCERN SINCE 30 JANUARY 2021.
 - Any person who has been to any Western Australian locations visited by confirmed cases or the Perth, Peel or South West Regions Of Western Australia Since 25 January 2021.
 - New Zealand – any person who has been to any contact tracing locations of interest in New Zealand.

Visitor Numbers:

- Hunter and Mid Coast Residential Aged Care Homes – no restrictions on number of visitors between 9am-12noon and 1pm-5pm except all homes can only accommodate a maximum of 3 people in a resident room at any one time
- Warnervale Gardens, Central Coast – there are no restrictions on the number of visitors a resident can have each day or at any one time with the exception that all homes can only accommodate a maximum of 3 people in a resident room at any one time. Visitor hours between 9am-12noon and 1pm-5pm.

Outings:

- Hunter, Central Coast and Mid Coast Residential Aged Care Homes residents
 - can leave the facility for outings such as medical appointments or to visit locations in the community such as shops and cafes.
- Ensure the event complies with the current movement and gathering public health order.

Could we ask that if possible for weekend outings, family advise the home on Friday if they would like to take their loved one out so that staff can complete the risk assessment in advance.
