

# Anglican Care Advice to Residents, Families & Friends COVID-19 Update - VISITATION

Please note that any new information since our previous correspondence has been CAPITALISED for your easy reference.

The following **LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS** are under stay at home Orders:

- **NEWCASTLE, LAKE MACQUARIE, MAITLAND, PORT STEPHENS, CESSNOCK, DUNGOG, SINGLETON AND MUSWELLBROOK FROM 31 JULY 2021 UNTIL 19 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**
- **ARMIDALE FROM 29 JULY 2021 UNTIL 14 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**
- **TAMWORTH FROM 5 AUGUST 2021 UNTIL 16 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**
- **BALLINA, BYRON, LISMORE AND RICHMOND VALLEY FROM 31 JULY 2021 UNTIL 16 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**
- **DUBBO FROM 1 AUGUST 2021 UNTIL 18 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**
- **BOGAN, BOURKE, BREWARRINA, COONAMBLE, GILGANDRA, NARROMINE, WALGETT AND WARREN FROM 5 AUGUST 2021 UNTIL 19 AUGUST 2021 (INCLUSIVE).**

For our aged care homes on the **Central Coast, NEWCASTLE AND LAKE MACQUARIE** the following applies;

- No visitors, except those providing essential caring functions and end of life visits.
- Ensure that all staff and essential care visitors wear a surgical mask.
- Ensure all essential visits must be in the resident's room.

For **all of our other aged care homes** the following applies;

- All staff and visitors must wear a surgical mask.
- Only two visitors should be allowed each day
- Visits should be in the resident's room or another suitable location in the facility as directed by the facility manager

**THERE ARE NEW CLOSE AND CASUAL CONTACT LOCATIONS IN GREATER SYDNEY AND ALSO IN REGIONAL NSW AREAS.**

There are restrictions for Victoria and the Australian Capital Territory.

Victoria, Queensland and the Australian Capital Territory are considered affected areas and there are close and casual contact places of high concern. To view locations please see Latest COVID-19 case locations and alerts in NSW.

From 1 June to 30 September 2021 visitors should not enter an aged care facility if they have not received a dose of the 2021 influenza vaccine, unless they meet the criteria under the exceptional and special circumstances.

**MASKS:** All staff and visitors must wear a surgical mask.

**Until further notice the following visitors are restricted from accessing Residential Aged Care Homes in NSW:**

- have been to any [close, casual or monitor for symptoms locations](#) in NSW in the last 14 days
- live or have been to Greater Sydney in the last 14 days unless providing [essential caring functions](#) or end of life visits
- have been to Victoria since 5 August 2021 or the Australian Capital Territory since 5 August 2021 unless providing [essential caring functions](#) or for end of life visits.
- have COVID-19 symptoms – including a fever (temperature of 37.5°C or higher)
  - Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, headache, fatigue, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, and loss of taste or loss of smell. Other reported symptoms of COVID-19 include muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite and acute blocked nose congestion.
- are a close contact of a person with confirmed COVID-19 and are within their self-isolation period.
- live in a household with a person who is currently self-isolating (including a person awaiting a COVID-19 test result).
- are waiting for a COVID-19 test result.

Please note: In exceptional circumstances, it may be possible for some types of exempt visitors to be allowed entry into one of the Residential Aged Care Homes on compassionate grounds (e.g. imminent death of a loved one), or for essential care purposes. This exemption will only be permitted by the General Manager Residential Care Services or delegate, via an approved risk assessment.

**Visitor Numbers and Visiting Times:**

FOR OUR AGED CARE HOMES ON THE **CENTRAL COAST, NEWCASTLE AND LAKE MACQUARIE** THE FOLLOWING APPLIES;

- No visitors, except those providing [essential caring functions and end of life visits](#)
- All visitors must wear a surgical mask. For reasons when masks can be removed please see [Additional Advice](#).

FOR ALL OUR **OTHER** AGED CARE HOMES THE FOLLOWING APPLIES;

- only two visitors should be allowed each day
- visits should be in the resident's room or another suitable location in the facility
- All visitors must wear a surgical mask. For reasons when masks can be removed please see [Additional Advice](#).

### **Outings:**

Residents from our AGED Care Homes LOCATED IN THE CENTRAL COAST, NEWCASTLE AND LAKE MACQUARIE LGA's should not leave the facility **except for essential reasons (eg medical appointments)**

Residents from our other Aged Care Homes –

- Residents in our age care homes located in the rest of NSW **SHOULD NOT ATTEND** a gathering with anyone present who has been in the Greater Sydney **OR THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS LISTED ABOVE**.
- Residents leaving the aged care home for an outing, family gathering or group excursion ensure that:
  - the event complies with the current [Gathering Restrictions Public Health Order \(No 2\) 2021](#) and the [Public Health \(COVID-19 Greater Sydney\)\(No 2\) Order 2021](#) and the [PublicHealth \(COVID-19 Greater Sydney\) Order \(No 2\) Amendment Order \(No 2\) 2021](#).
  - no one at the event:
    - has, in the past 14 days, been to any NSW, Interstate or New Zealand locations at the dates and times listed in the [latest COVID-19 case locations](#)
    - has been a close contact of a person with confirmed COVID-19 in the last 14 days
    - lives in a household with a person who is currently self-isolating
    - is waiting for a COVID-19 test result.
- Please note resident or person responsible are required to complete a risk assessment form prior to leaving the residential aged care home. Could we ask that if possible, for weekend outings, family advise the home on Friday if they would like to take their loved one out so that staff can complete the risk assessment in advance. Thank you.
