Single Room with ensuite

RAD 450,000 DAP \$100.48

Please note: the prices above are subject to change and shall vary in accordance with the Maximum Permissible Interest Rate (MPIR) as determined by the Department of Social Services on a quarterly basis.

Pricing options

Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD)

A lump sum payment made to the aged care home that is fully refunded to you or your estate when you leave the home.

or

Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP)

This payment is not refundable. Some people may prefer to pay for their accommodation based on a daily rate.

or

A combination of RAD and DAP

If you decide to make a combined RAD and DAP payment, the DAP amount will be adjusted based on the lump sum amount paid.

Below is an example of a combined RAD and DAP payment based on a RAD of \$450,000. In this example the resident has \$225,000 available for part payment of the RAD. This means the DAP is worked out on the remaining \$225,000 using an MPIR of 8.15%.

$DAP = 225,000 \times 8.15\% \div 365$

$DAP = \$50.24$

So instead of paying the full RAD of \$450,00 the resident would pay a part RAD of \$225,000 as well as a DAP of \$50.24
